Glencore Community Support Fund – Support in Switzerland

Glencore sets up a fund to help people and communities around the world affected by COVID 19. Part of the fund is being used in Switzerland to support national and regional organisations.

Glencore has set up a community support fund worth USD 25 million in response to the global COVID-19 pandemic.

The fund will help our teams in more than 35 countries around the world provide urgently needed assistance to local communities. Our teams are working closely with governments, health authorities and other key responders to identify and manage local needs and challenges relating to the coronavirus as quickly as possible.

In addition to financial support, our local operations are also mobilizing internal resources and using them to provide in-kind support where possible. Due to the expected socio-economic impact of the pandemic, our long-term focus will lie on rebuilding local communities. Accordingly, some of our existing social investment programmes will be adapted to the changing social needs of local communities during and after the crisis. Furthermore, medical personnel who provide exceptional services during this demanding period are also taken into account. In addition, our employees are free to do voluntary work during working hours where this is possible.
